


Protect Coverdale

from an intrusive
communications
network



HAVE YOU ASKED YOURSELF THESE QUESTIONS ... ?

- Are you happy that beautiful Coverdale, situated in the Yorkshire Dales National Park (YDNP), is going to be used as a test-bed for what is a very visually intrusive communications network? 5G coverage would mean not only masts, but repeater stations every 300 metres to work effectively.
- Have you ever struggled to get planning permission within the YDNP? If so, is it fair that the YDNP are rushing through permission for FOUR 45ft masts with minimal consultation?
- Does your source of information regarding Electro-Magnetic Radiation (EMR) and 5G rely solely on literature and consultation from [Mobile Access North Yorkshire \(MANY\)](#) employees? How unbiased do you consider their opinions to be?
- Do you believe that those landowners who have agreed to have masts sited on their land have been fully briefed on the proven dangers to health and ecology? Have they read the Farmers Weekly article (29 January 2020) stating how farmers with masts on their land "must fully understand radiation exclusion zones to safeguard people's health and protect against potential liability claims"?



- Are they also aware of the unfettered rights of installer to upgrade the size, power and antenna infrastructure of the mast going forward?
- Would you trust **MANY** to be acting in Coverdale's best interests, if you knew that the founder of Huawei has said that 'Human societies do not need 5G; they need broadband, which is not a major component of 5G', and that 5G is not a solution to improve voice calls? Would you be interested in other forms of high-speed connectivity?
- Are you fully aware of the health implications of Electro-Magnetic Radiation to both humans, stock, birdlife and ecology? Did you know that, based on recent research, several eminent EMR scientists are now urging the International Agency for Research on Cancer to upgrade EMR to a class 1 carcinogen (cancer causing)?
- A substantial proportion of Coverdale residents have never been consulted or even informed about this rollout. Given the environmental, ecological and health impact of the proposed project, do you believe that this is reasonable behaviour?

THE NEXT STEPS ...

A growing number of us are urgently asking the National Park to stop the rollout of the masts until Coverdale residents have seen all the facts and decided for themselves whether they approve of the plan.

I urge you to listen to a Zoom presentation, which is happening every Thursday at 6pm starting on the 3rd December 2020, by Mike Sparrow, who was a Managing Director of an international utilities construction company and chief operating officer of Balfour Beatty Services.
